



Opening of the Aquatic Complex

Entertainment options abound at Parc Jean-Drapeau

Montréal, July 15, 2020 – One of Canada's finest aquatic complexes will again be accessible to users as of Saturday, July 18. The three swimming pools at Parc Jean-Drapeau are reopening to swimmers, for competitive training purposes or for a relaxing time in the water, either alone or with your family.

Three outstanding water areas

The Aquatic Complex has three pools, in addition to cool, shady spots and water games that provide fun for all:

- **Recreational pool:** Open to everyone, this gradual-slope pool is great for swimming and playing in the water. The bottom of the pool has a cushioned rubber mat for children's comfort and safety. The recreational pool also has four swimming lanes for swimmers that want to do some laps.
- **Diving pool:** The pool has several springboard heights, ranging from 1m, 3m, 5m, 7.5m and 10m. for diving training.
- **Competition pool:** This international calibre pool is for training sessions and will be reserved for swim teams and playing such sports as water-polo.

New health and safety measures at the Parc

The Société du parc Jean-Drapeau has prepared to welcome visitors by devising constructive action plans in compliance with health and safety measures. As a result, the capacity of the Aquatic Complex has gone from 1,200 people to 169, to meet the physical distancing recommendations issued by the public health department.

Visitors are now required to reserve a beach time in the morning or afternoon, and they will have to adhere to the appointed time of their reservation. A one-hour interval has been scheduled between the two time periods so that the site can be completely cleaned. Four blocks of time, of two-hour duration, are available during the day. The online reservation system will be accessible, as of July 15, on the Parc Jean-Drapeau [website](#)

Swimmers must arrive at the Aquatic Complex with their bathing suit already on, and they must bring their own personal flotation device, if needed, because they will not have access to changing rooms or the equipment rental system. Many hand-washing stations have been set up on the site and quotas on the number of visitors that can use the washrooms at the same time are also in effect.



Price-grid and how to get there

The Aquatic Complex is open daily from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. until September 7. Admission fees have been revised downward, and they have been set at \$3 for children aged 3 to 13, \$6.50 for 14 years and older, \$15 for a family of two adults and two children, and \$5 for the lap-swimming lanes.

This outstanding facility is mere steps from the Jean-Drapeau subway station. Parking lot P10 will also be available, with an adjusted price structure to accommodate visitors that want to go the Aquatic Complex by car. BIXI bike stations are set up near the site.
